





Chapter 2

Installation

2.1 Transport and Unpacking

2.1.1 Transport

When accepting a delivery, please check the packaging for visible transportation damage and check the delivery for completeness by comparing it with your order form. If you notice any shipping damage or inconsistencies between the contents and your order, please inform the responsible delivery service immediately. During transportation, the TPC system should be protected from excessive mechanical stress. If the TPC system is transported or stored without packaging, shocks, vibrations, pressure, and moisture may impact the unprotected unit. Additionally, damaged packaging indicates that ambient conditions have already had a massive impact on the device. Therefore, please use the original packaging during transportation and storage. If the TPC system is transported in cold weather or is exposed to extreme variations in temperature, ensure that moisture (condensation) does not build up on or inside the HMI device. Moisture can result in short circuits and damage to the device. To avoid this, store the TPC system in a dry environment and bring the system to room temperature before powering it up. If condensation occurs, a delay time of approximately 12 hours must be allowed to ensure that the system is completely dry before being switched on.

2.1.2 Unpacking

- 1. Unpack the TPC-307W device.
- Configure the power mode if necessary (default: AT mode). See Section 2.5.
- Connect the power connector to the 24 VDC power lines of a power adapter or in-house power source. DC power source shall be complied with ES1 and PS2 requirements, output rating is 24 Vdc, minimum 0.83A, with minimum operating temperature 60°C, and has to be evaluated according to IEC/UL 60950-1 and/or IEC/UL 62368-1.




Figure 2.1 Power Connector and Power Lines

4. Plug the power lines into the system power receptor.

The terminal block is suitable for 12-24 AWG. Torque value 3 lb-in. Use copper conductors only. Must be installed by skilled person.





Figure 2.2 Power Connector

5. Power on the system. The power LED turns to blue.

6. Calibrate the touchscreen.

2.2 Panel Mount

There is an adhesive waterproof gasket on the front bezel. Make sure the waterproof gasket is in position before installing the TPC-307W panel computer into the panel opening.

 Install the TPC into the panel opening. For adequate air circulation, the TPC requires a certain clearance on all sides. The following diagram illustrates the minimum clearance (100mm) and the air inlet and outlet directions (blue arrows). The suggested mounting panel thickness is less than 6mm (0.236").




Figure 2.4 Panel Mounting – Positioning

2. Find the four clamps and four long screws in the accessory pack. Insert the screws (M4 x 25mm) into each clamp and tighten them to fasten the clamp in place.




Figure 2.5 Panel Mounting - Clamp with Screw

3. Hook the clamp into the holes around the four sides of the bezel and fasten the screws (torque: 2 kgf-cm). These screws will push the mounting panel and secure the unit.




Figure 2.6 Panel Mounting - Clamp Fixing

2.3 VESA Mount

The TPC-307W's rear cover features four VESA mounting (75 x 75 mm) holes. The VESA mounting kit needs to be installed by 4pcs M4x10L screws. Please use suitable mounting apparatus to avoid risk of injury.




Figure 2.7 VESA Mounting

2.4 Cabinet Installation and Earth Grounding Setup

Follow the following steps to setup TPC-307W system, and please pay attention that Ground pin of TPC-307W system should be connected to earth ground. Under this circumstance, TPC-307W system could have the best performance such as EMI immunity, ESD immunity, surge immunity and also system isolation. If the TPC-307W system is embedded in the cabinet, the TPC-307W system's ground, cabinet's ground and earth ground should be connected together.

2.4.1 Installing TPC into Cabinet.

- 1. Connect the cabinet to earth ground.
- 2. Embed null TPC-307W system into the cabinet without any I/O cable and power.




Figure 2.8 Cabinet Installation

2.4.2 System Wiring

- 1. Connect the cabinet to earth ground.
- 2. Ensure that all cabinet has been grounded together.
- 3. Connect the ground of the power supply to the cabinet.
- 4. Connect the ground pin of the TPC-307W system to the cabinet.
- 5. Connect the I/O to the controller if needed.
- 6. Connect the V+ and V- of power supply to the TPC-307W system.
- 7. While completing step 1 to 6 step by step, you can supply power to the TPC-307W system now.


NOTE! Make sure all wires follow the installation guidelines to avoid performance issues.

2.5 System configuration

TPC-307W is a compact touch panel with IIoT functions for industrial applications. The system setup will be completed by the dealer or system integrator prior to delivery. However, users may still need to access the system to adjust configuration, such as the interfaces or boot modes. Before powering on, please open the rear bracket and select the correct power mode.

2.5.1 Rear Bracket Removal

The rear bracket is a part of the system that requires removal before changing the settings or installing new modules. It is secured to the system by 8 screws as shown below. After taking out all the screws, gently lift the rear bracket and place it aside. Care should be taken not to damage the system or the bracket during this process.






Figure A.1 Board Layout - Top View

BIOS Setup

With the AMI BIOS Setup program, users can modify the BIOS settings and control various system features. This chapter describes the basic navigation of the BIOS Setup Utility.



AMI's BIOS ROM has a built-in setup program that allows users to modify the basic system configuration. The setup information is stored in flash ROM to ensure it is retained when the system is powered off.

B.1 Entering Setup

Turn on the computer and check for the patch code. If there is a number assigned to the patch code, it means that the BIOS supports your CPU. If there is no number assigned to the patch code, contact an Advantech application engineer to obtain an up-to-date patch code file. This will ensure that the CPU status is valid. After ensuring that you have a number assigned to the patch code, press to access the BIOS Setup Utility.

B.2 Main Setup

Upon entering the BIOS Setup Utility, users will be on the Main setup screen. At any point during the configuration, users can return to the Main setup screen by selecting the Main tab. There are two Main setup options, which are described in this section. The Main setup screen is shown below.



The Main setup screen has two main frames. The left frame displays all the options that can be configured. Grayed-out options cannot be configured, whereas options presented in blue can be configured. The right frame displays the key legend.


Above the key legend is an area reserved for a text message. When an option is selected in the left frame, it is highlighted in white. Often a text message will accompany an option.

System Time/System Date


Use this option to change the system time and date. Highlight System Time or System Date using the <Arrow> keys. Enter new values via the keyboard. Press the <Enter> key to move between fields. The date must be entered in MM/DD/YY format. The time must be entered in HH:MM:SS format.

B.3 Advanced BIOS Features Setup

Select the Advanced tab from the TPC-307W setup screen to enter the Advanced BIOS Setup screen. Users can select any of the items in the left frame of the screen, such as ACPI Settings and hit <enter> to access the submenu for that item. Users can display an Advanced BIOS Setup option by highlighting it using the <Arrow> keys. All Advanced BIOS Setup options are described in this section. The Advanced BIOS setup screen is shown below. The submenus are described on the following pages.
